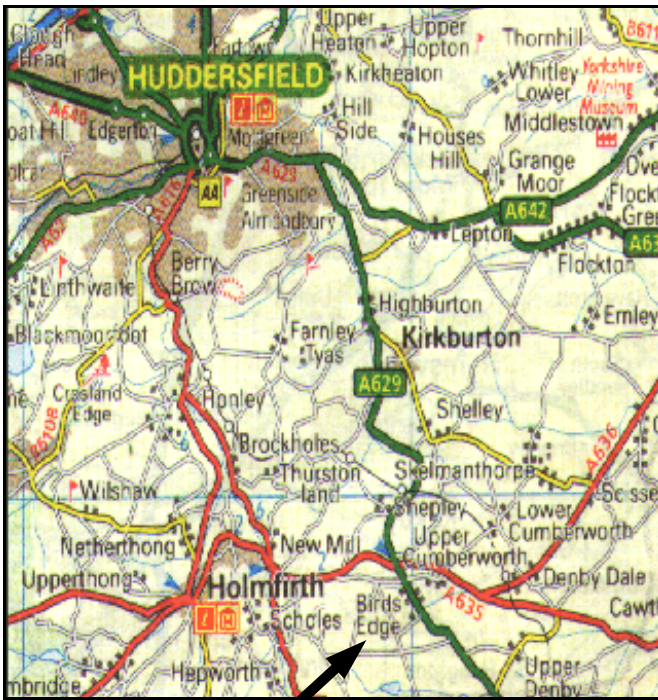


How to find
Birdsedge Village Festival HD8 8XP



We're looking forward to
seeing you

Saturday events begin at noon. Performers and stallholders please report to the festival office - a tent on the bottom field close to the top end of the marquee - and check in with Jacey or Sarah from 10 am onwards.

Birdsedge is on the A629 about 9 miles south of Huddersfield, just half a mile south of where the A635 crosses the A629. The landmark at that crossroads is a pub called The Sovereign and a large petrol station on opposite diagonal corners.

The festival is in the centre of the village (downhill whichever way you come at it.) The access to the festival field for those setting up on Saturday (prior to 11.30 a.m.) is from Birdsedge Lane NOT from the A629 as in previous years. If coming from the south prepare to turn left off the A629; if coming from the north prepare to turn right.

CAR PARKING

Reserved Car Parking (stall holders, performers, staff and disabled vehicles only) is in the school playground. Turn up Birdsedge Lane and the entrance is immediately on your right,

Public parking is available in the Mill Yard and as signposted or you can park on-street along the main road, up Birdsedge Lane.

Please do not park on the resident's parking bay across the road from from the village hall. on the A629. Cars left there have been known to get parked in by desperate residents who have nowhere else to park. Thanks.

ACCESS TO THE FESTIVAL SITE

To bring vehicles on to the Festival Field please note that there is only one gateway for both entrance and exit - turn in through the rec gate on Birdsedge Lane - above the school. There are children's swains here. We hope they will not be in use but we can't guarantee children will not sneak past our stewards into what is normally their playground, so. Please be patient and CAREFUL.

Stallholders and exhibitors: please unload and park in your allowed space or remove your vehicle by the top gate before 11.45 and put it in the reserved car park.

NOTE: no vehicles are allowed to move on the field while the festival site is open to the public between 12 noon and 5.00 p.m. except in an emergency, when vehicles must display hazard warning lights and be "walked" through public areas by a steward. THIS MEANS YOU.
